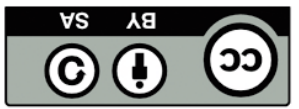

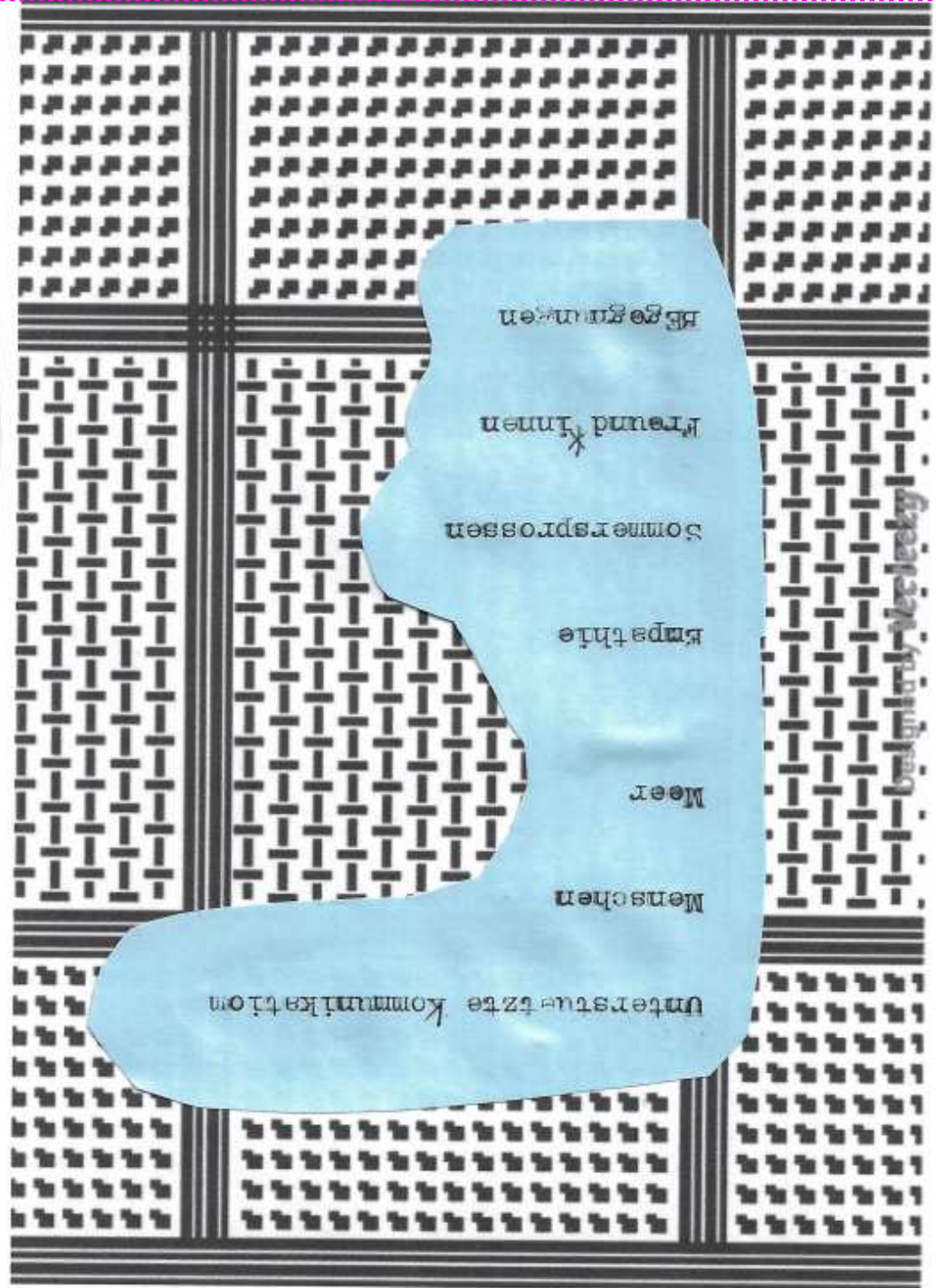
I care about the freedom of Palestinian people
